Budget Narrative for the Sunnyslope Church

It's Stewardship Season at the Sunnyslope Church. It's the time of year that we emphasize how we care for the time, talent, and financial resources God has entrusted to each and every one of us. For the next few weeks, we will be sharing short stories and narratives to help us understand how our church community uses its resources -- offerings that we collect, our building, and how we support others in Wenatchee and around the world.

You may or not know that hiring Dane was the culmination of many years of preparation and cultivation of our attendees and leadership. And I want to remind people that Dane committed to three years, and one year is nearly over. The three-year time period was to rediscover our purpose or to close up shop. We planned to use up most of our resources in that time and if still struggling to survive we would likely shut our Brethren and United Church of Christ doors for good.

For this church to survive in the form it is in, we need money. Our budget for this current year is \$154,000. The largest part of our income is from annual pledges of the members, close to \$60,000. **Pledges help us to plan the budget for next year**. Each household or individual during this season discerns and reports to the financial secretary/treasurer how much financial support we can expect from them in the coming months. We use those numbers to budget for the coming year. The next largest part of this year's budget is about \$50,000 we plan to use from our savings which only holds \$106,868. Other income is from loose offerings in our weekly worship service (\$9,000), building use fees (\$6,000), and some carryover from last year (Around \$10,000).

Where does that \$154,000 go you ask? The largest part is for our professional pastoral leadership and two part-time staff members -- Secretary and Custodian. Not only do we pay salaries, but also pay social security and expenses required to do the work, the pastor housing allowance and health insurance. All the employee expenses total just over \$100,000. About \$15,000 goes annually to maintain this facility; Natural gas, water, electricity, garbage, telephone and internet, postage, office supplies, insurance, property maintenance, and other miscellaneous odds and ends. Sometimes we need to add in major one-time expenses like connecting to the new sewer and repairing or replacing one of our three furnaces.

We give just over \$8,000 to our denominational partnerships, both the Church of the Brethren and United Church of Christ, nationally and the COB district office and UCC conference. That also supports the Open and Affirming organizations in both denominations. Also in that \$8,000 are smaller gifts to Wenatchee Immigrant Justice, Bethany Theological Seminary (COB), University of Laverne, that provides accessible and affordable education (and is a COB related school in Southern California), and finally we support On Earth Peace, a peace and justice organization related to the Church of the Brethren. And we also use funds internally for general programs of the church, such as Christian education, worship services, celebrations and hospitality, music, curriculum, pulpit supply (guest speaker expenses), and nursery attendant. That amounts to \$3,350 this year. I need to mention a couple of other people that serve the congregation that in other churches would likely be paid positions costing as much as \$10,000 a year or more. Our musicians are simply volunteering their time and talent, as well as our audio/video operators. What a blessing they are for our times together. And other volunteers greet and usher on Sunday mornings, bring snacks for after church, serve as deacons caring for the members, and the list goes on and on. I'd like to finish up by throwing out a thought that we can't un-think, like Ben mentioned a few weeks ago in the Sunday service. What if this year we received enough pledges of support that we don't need to use any of the church's savings accounts and instead had that available to do God's work in the community? That would be possible if the average pledge this year was \$215 per month per household. Wouldn't that be something?

There will be pledge cards available in the next few weeks so please prayerfully consider what your household can pledge or invest in this place next year. Wenatchee and the whole wide world need this congregation.

I have had the Holy Spirit's help on many occasions when I least expected it. I am a hula dancer, I can pa'i (drum) and chant, practicing both ancient sacred (kahiko) hula and modern (auana) hula. I work as an elder law attorney, certified professional guardian and I am a former geriatric nurse practitioner. I am a wife and a mother of a lovely 26 year old daughter. I love my family, my dogs, and being outdoors.

Question: Why Sunnyslope Church?

Sunnyslope is the gueer sanctuary I was looking for - a blend of Christianity and supportive community. The first Sunday we attended was Rev. Dane's first Sunday, and Ben Green, Carol Bowman, Dane and Jameson Varpness listened to our story and warmly welcomed us into the community. We stayed and have been happy here. I am currently the chair of worship and love being involved with crafting Sunday services. The connections I find when preaching and giving out communion are true gifts.
