Getting to Know Marsha Neher

I am Marsha Miller Neher. I moved to Wenatchee in 1972 when I was a junior in high school. My dad had been hired as the minister of Sunnyslope Church of the Brethren. Except for 4 years at the University of LaVerne in California and a year in Brethren Volunteer Service, I have lived in Wenatchee.

Packing Friendship

SUNNYSLOPE SCHOOL NEEDS 19 BAGS OF FOOD PER WEEK. WE HAVE STEPPED UP TO MEET THIS NEED!

We are providing a great service to hungry children in our neighborhood. Please continue to check the list of food items to see what is currently needed. That list, located in the fellowship hall, changes regularly and your support is greatly appreciated!!!

Shelf Stable Milk | Single Serve Pasta | Fruit Cups | Fruit Juice Boxes Pudding | Canned Tuna and/or Chicken

Packing Friendship is a hunger relief program, intended to provide food for children who are at risk of going hungry over the weekends. The students served by Packing Friendship typically rely on the free and reduced lunch program at school to provide their breakfast and lunch during the school week. Packing Friendship seeks to bridge the hunger gap over the weekend. Packing Friendship is a collaboration between local churches and service organizations, providing food to students at schools within the Wenatchee and Eastmont School Districts.

You can help support this program by donating food! All foods can be left on the Packing Friendship Cart that is located near the entrance to the Fellowship Hall in our building. Packing Friendship began as a small program at Grace Lutheran Church in the spring of 2011, serving 12 students at three schools. Since that time the program, which is operated completely by volunteers, has grown throughout the community. Sunnyslope Church became involved in 2013. Each participating church or organization has one person who serves as a coordinator and attends bi-annual Packing Friendship Coordinators meetings. Many volunteers are involved in the operation of this program on a weekly basis. In total more than 400 volunteers do all of the planning, shopping, sorting, packing, and delivering of the food for the program.


Cultivating Justice
